



Answer: Gouty arthritis



Gout is a crystal arthropathy due to deposition of monosodium urate crystals in and around the joints. Usually has an asymmetrical polyarticular distribution with **1st MTP joint** most commonly involved. The typical appearance is the presence of well-defined "**punched-out**" **erosions** (arrow) with sclerotic margins in a marginal and juxta-articular distribution, with overhanging edges.
